Why now?

A vision to Plan our Future. Together.

Now that we have determined the location of our South Campus in Innisfil, we will work with the Ministry of Health to ensure we can secure approvals and get shovels in the ground as soon as possible.

We're excited to keep moving forward with our expansion plans and including you every step of the way.

Why is there urgency?

Exploding population

The population in south Simcoe County is booming and is projected to double over the next 20 years with over 74,000 new residents in Innisfil alone.

Capacity challenges

RVH is experiencing critical capacity challenges. In fact, our occupancy rate is consistently over 115 per cent.

Site constraints

RVH's 40-acre site on Georgian Drive—the North Campus—is almost fully utilized. Expansion, including a nine-storey tower at the North Campus, as well as development of the South Campus, will enable RVH to meet residents' healthcare needs in the future.

Aging population

Simcoe County has an aging population that is growing at a rate faster than the provincial average. In 25 years, Simcoe County will have over 107,000 more seniors than it does today, making up 27 per cent of the population. Seniors use hospital services four times more frequently than the rest of the population.

Population health

Not only is our population growing and aging, but unfortunately we have a lot of risk factors that impact the kind of healthcare we'll need in the future. In fact, almost 45 per cent of our region's residents have a chronic condition and one in five have multiple chronic conditions. Clinics at the South Campus will focus on preventing health conditions and promoting healthy living, before people need hospital inpatient services.
