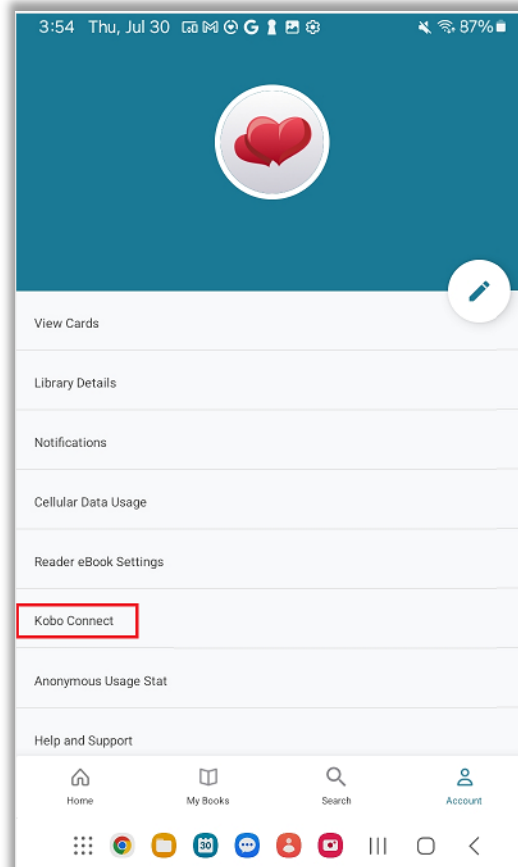


Steps to Connect and Send Titles to Kobo via CloudLibrary Integration

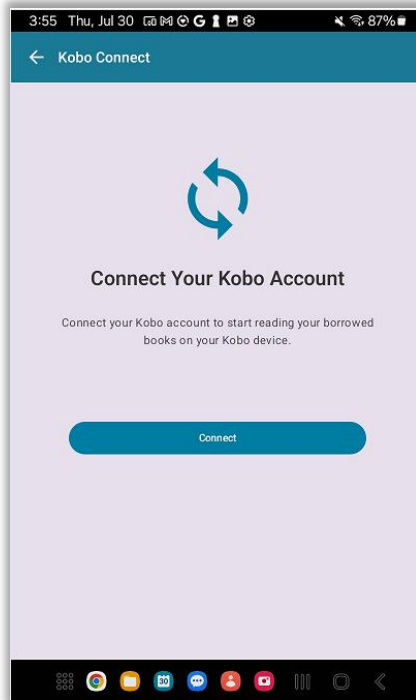
Connecting CloudLibrary to Kobo

Mobile App Instructions:

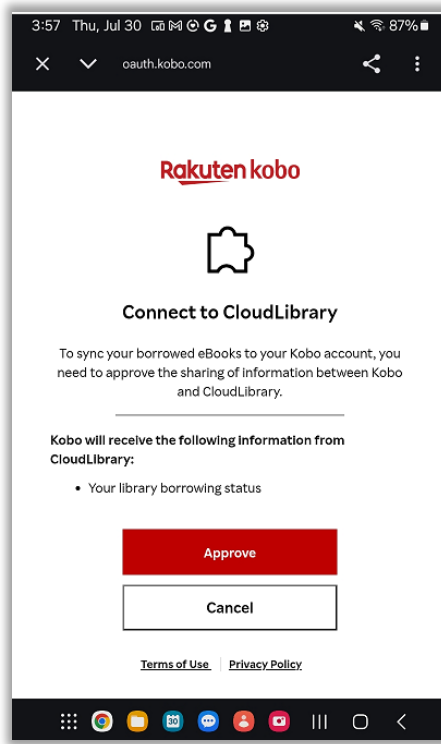
1. Login to the CloudLibrary app with your library barcode number and PIN (if required).
2. Go to **Account > Kobo Connect**.



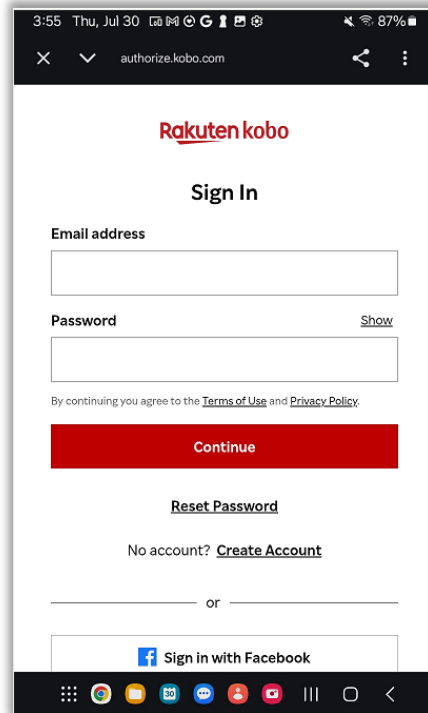
3. Tap the **Connect** button.



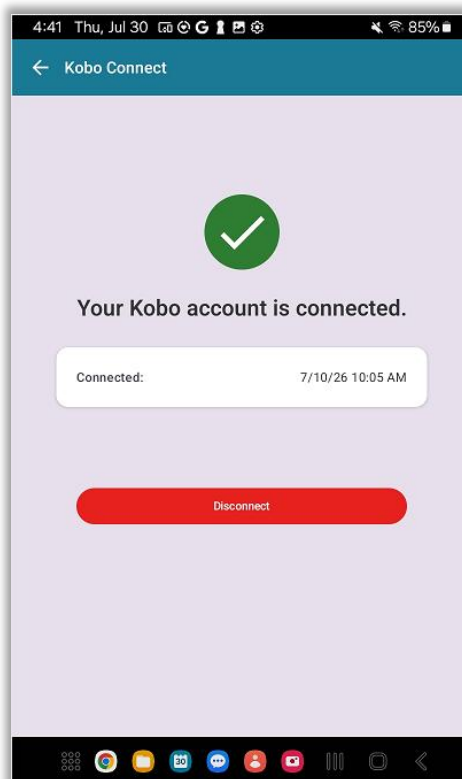
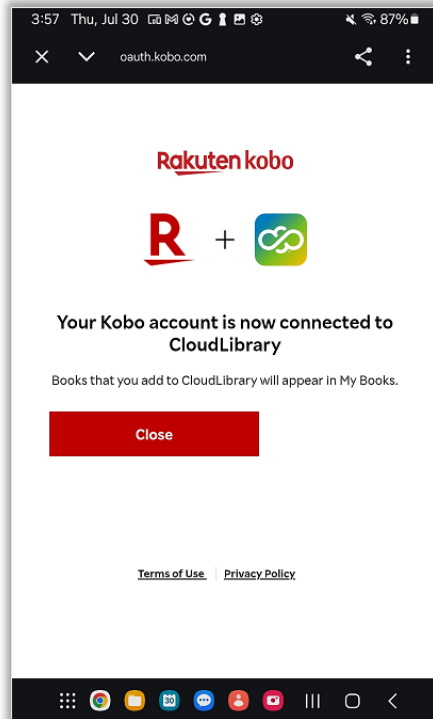
4. At the next screen, tap **Approve**.



5. Kobo's login page will display and you can login with the email address and password for your Kobo account and tap **Continue** or if needed, tap **Create Account**.

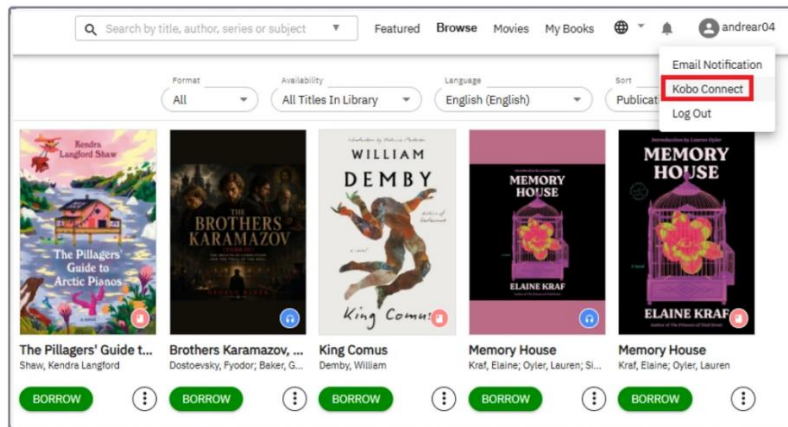


6. When complete, a message will display indicating your Kobo account is connected. Tap Close to go back to the CloudLibrary app.



Web Patron Instructions:

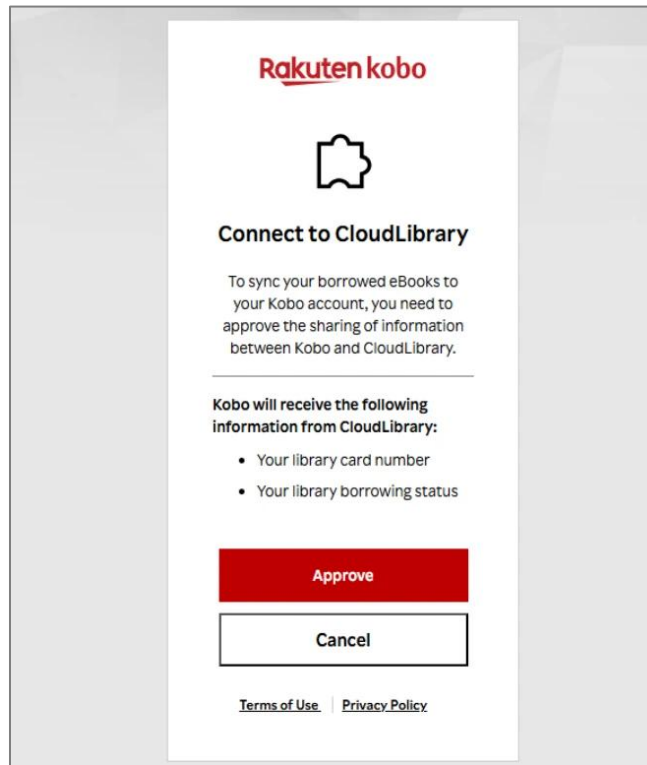
1. Go to <https://www.yourcloudlibrary.com/> and use the Country, State, and Library drop-down menus to find your library.
2. Click **Login** in the upper right corner of the screen. Enter your library card number and PIN if applicable and click the **Login** button.
3. Click on your **Library Card ID** in the upper right corner
4. From the drop-down menu, click **Kobo Connect**:



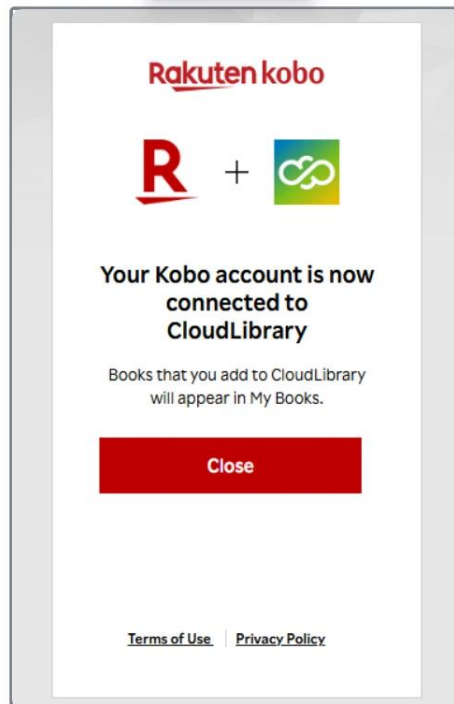
5. Kobo's login page will display and you can login with the email address and password for your Kobo account and click **Continue** or if needed, select **Create Account**:

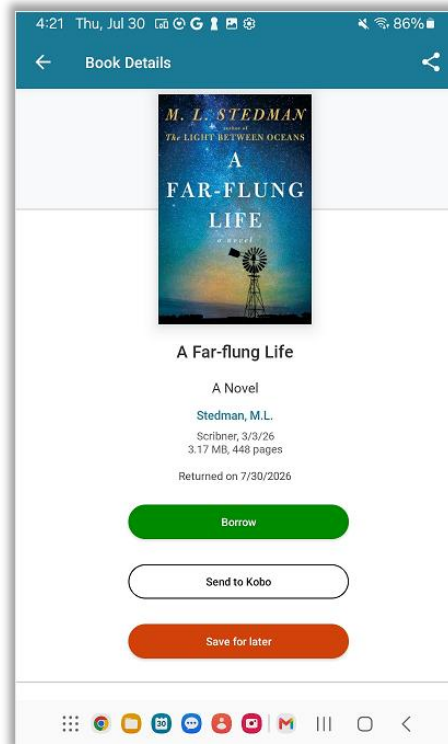
7. When complete, a message will display indicating your Kobo account is connected. Click **Close** to go back to Web Patron.

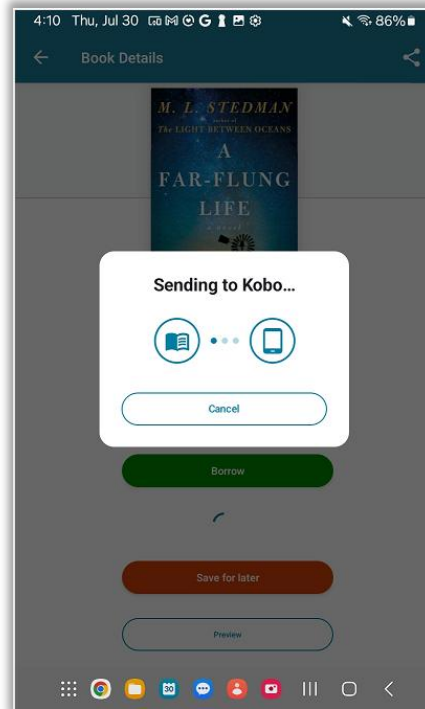


Sending Titles from CloudLibrary to Kobo

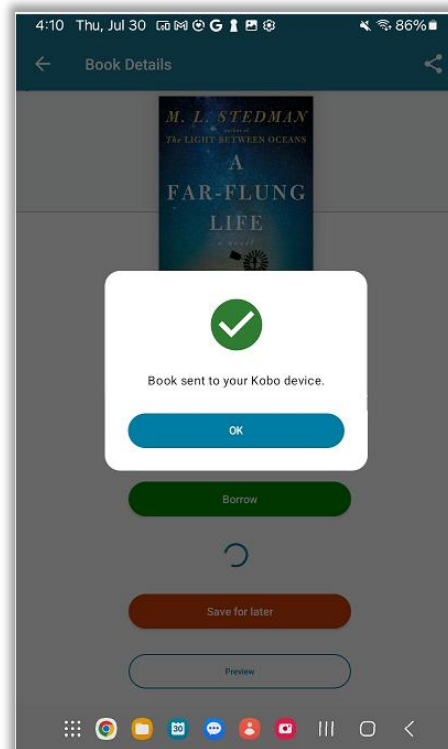
Mobile App Instructions:

1. Login to the CloudLibrary app with your library barcode number and PIN (if required).
2. Ensure your Kobo account is connected. To confirm, go to **Account > Kobo Connect**.
3. Tap the **Search** tab to browse Featured Shelves, Categories, or complete a Quick or Advanced Search to select an eBook. If your eBook is already borrowed, go to **My Books > Current**.
4. Tap the desired eBook title to open the Book Details page. Tap the **Send To Kobo** button.

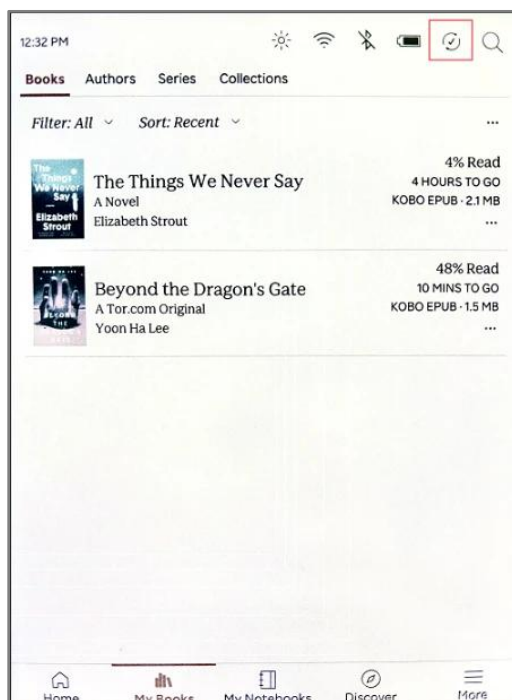




5. Once the title has been borrowed and sent, a message stating *Book sent to your Kobo device* populates. Tap the **OK** button.



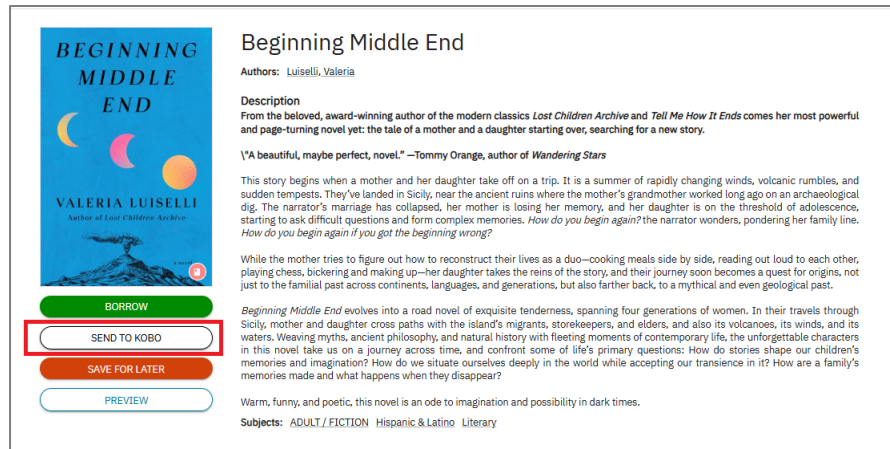
6. Please allow a few minutes for your CloudLibrary title to arrive to your Kobo. Users may need to tap the “Sync” button on the upper right side of the Kobo screen for the title to appear:



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4. Search for an eBook: click the **Browse** or **Featured** tabs to browse categories or featured shelves. Click the **Search** box to complete a Quick or Advanced Search. If your eBook is already borrowed, go to **My Books > Current**.

While the mother tries to figure out how to reconstruct their lives as a duo—cooking meals side by side, reading out loud to each other, playing chess, bickering and making up—her daughter takes the reins of the story, and their journey soon becomes a quest for origins, not just to the familial past across continents, languages, and generations, but also farther back, to a mythical and even geological past.

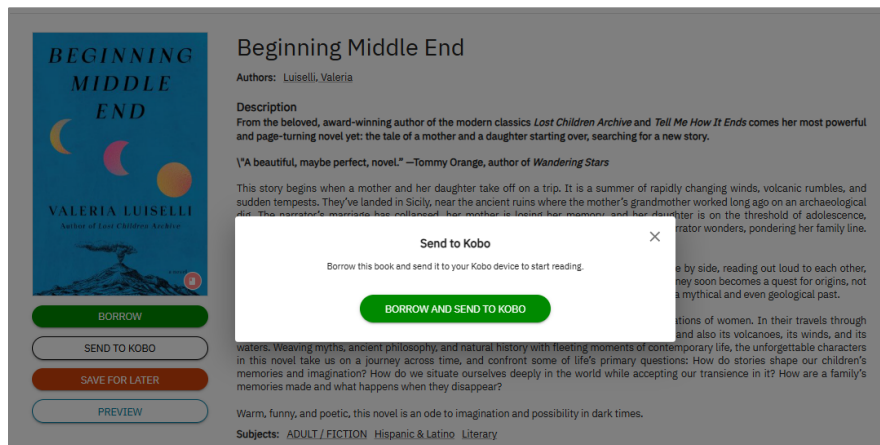

How do we situate ourselves deeply in the world while accepting our transience in it? How are a family's memories made and what happens when they disappear?

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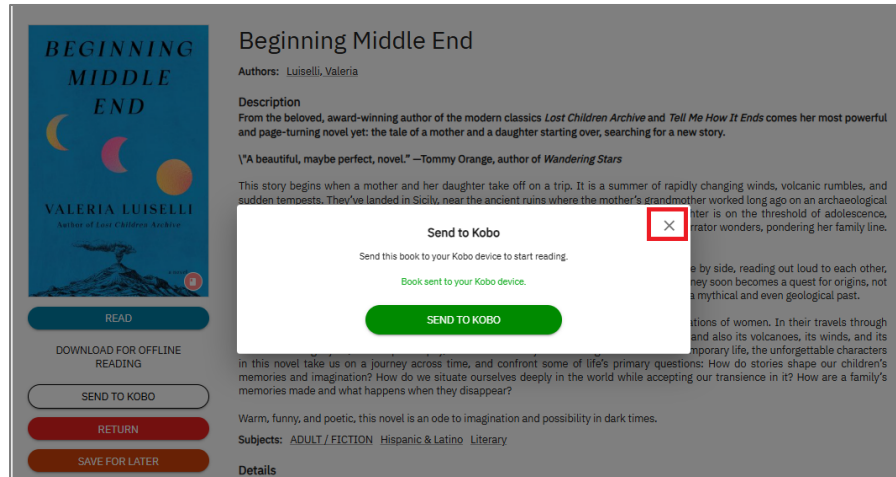
